

Anti-bullying policy

Staff at North Marston School are committed to promoting positive behaviour in school and discouraging bullying.

Any reports of bullying will be taken seriously and investigated. Appropriate action will then be taken, in order that the behaviour is changed and becomes acceptable.

Incidents reported at home or school will be discussed with a class teacher in the first instance. The matter may then be referred to a senior member of staff if necessary, so that a resolution can be found.

Certain types of behaviour eg. that which could cause harm to themselves or other members of the school, however, will be dealt with by the Head teacher and parents will be informed immediately.

Persistent and serious offenders may be issued with internal or external exclusions.

In extreme cases the local Community Police officer may be involved.

The school's code of practice is displayed in school to help all pupils.

Anti-bullying Code.

Are you being bullied or hurt by others?

Are you being called names, or being made fun of?

Have you had your possessions taken?

Do you know someone else who is being bullied?

If the answer to any of these questions is "yes",
this is what you should do:

Speak to your class teacher, or another member of staff.

Tell your parents or a friend.

Don't keep it a secret, we want to help.

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If you are doing any of these things and bullying other people, stop and think about your actions.

Put yourself in someone else's shoes and think how it feels!
